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**Institutional evaluation visit - IOSUD/doctoral study domains at the Romanian Academy (25 October - 5 November 2021) - Domain Law**

## **1. Methods used**

The evaluation in the domain of law was carried out in remote telematic modality following the indications of Aracis.

The methodology used provided for:

- The analysis of the internal evaluation report of the doctoral study domain under review and its Annexes;
- The analysis of documents, data and information available on the IOSUD/Doctoral School(s) website, in electronic format;
- Online Meeting/discussions with doctoral students in the doctoral study domain under review;
- Online Meeting/Discussions with the graduates of the doctoral study domain under review;
- Online Meeting/Discussions with the school officials of the Doctoral School(s) in which the doctoral study domain under review is operating;
- Online Meeting/Discussions with the doctoral advisors in the doctoral study domain under review;
- Online Meeting/discussions with the representatives of the various structures of the IOSUD/Doctoral School(s) in which the doctoral study domain under review is operating.

## **2. Analysis of ARACIS's performance indicators**

### ***Domain A. INSTITUTIONAL CAPACITY***

*The domain analysis was conducted according to Romanian legislation in the matter and the international and European best practices in evaluating doctoral schools.*

#### **Criterion A.1. The administrative, managerial institutional structures and the financial resources**



Standard A.1.1. The institution organizing doctoral studies (IOSUD) has implemented the effective functioning mechanisms provided for in the specific legislation on the organization of doctoral studies.

**Performance Indicator A.1.1.1.**

The visit confirmed the existence of complete and specific regulations and their coherent application at the level of the Doctoral School of the university doctoral study domain in Law.

Namely the visit evidenced the adequate presence of:

- (a) the internal regulations of the Doctoral School;
- (b) the Methodology for conducting elections for the position of director of the Council of doctoral school (CSD), as well as elections by the students of their representative in CSD and the evidence of their conduct;
- (c) the Methodologies for organizing and conducting doctoral studies (for the admission of doctoral students, for the completion of doctoral studies);
- (d) the existence of mechanisms for recognizing the status of a Doctoral advisor and the equivalence of the doctoral degree obtained abroad;
- (e) functional management structures (Council of the doctoral school), giving as well proof of the regularity of meetings;
- (f) the contract for doctoral studies;
- (g) internal procedures for the analysis and approval of proposals regarding the training for doctoral study programs based on advanced academic studies.
  - description of the facts, the findings from the assessed institution's documents and the evaluation visit itself

Recommendations:

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator A.1.1.2.** The doctoral school' Regulation includes mandatory criteria, procedures and standards binding on the aspects specified in Article 17, paragraph (5) of the Government Decision No. 681/2011 on the approval of the Code of Doctoral Studies with subsequent amendments and additions.

- The visit confirmed the full coherence between the assessed institution's documents and the concrete implementation of them. Particularly, the procedure for admission is satisfactory, because it is implemented according to the regulations and best practices at international level. Transparency of procedure is ensured because the information are accessible and published in advance on the website of the Academia.

Recommendations:

**The indicator is fulfilled.**



Standard A.1.2. *The IOSUD has the logistical resources necessary to carry out the doctoral studies' mission.*

**Performance Indicator A.1.2.1.** *The existence and effectiveness of an appropriate IT system to keep track of doctoral students and their academic background.*

- *The visit confirmed the existence and full effectiveness of an appropriate IT system to keep track of doctoral students and their academic background.*

- *The facts as findings from the assessed institution's documents confirm the evaluation of the indicator, also through the evaluation visit, into the limits of an online visit, but performed through satisfactory meetings with the involved actors.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator A.1.2.2.** *The existence and use of an appropriate software program and evidence of its use to verify the percentage of similarity in all doctoral theses.*

- *The visit and discussion with confirm the use of an appropriate software program used to verify the percentage of similarity in all doctoral theses.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

Standard A.1.3. *The IOSUD makes sure that financial resources are used optimally, and the revenues obtained from doctoral studies are supplemented through additional funding besides governmental funding.*

*\*general description of the standard analysis.*

**Performance Indicator A.1.3.1.** *Existence of at least one research or institutional / human resources development grant under implementation at the time of submission of the internal evaluation file, per doctoral study domain under evaluation, or existence of at least 2 research or institutional development / human resources grant for the doctoral study domain, obtained by doctoral thesis advisors operating in the evaluated domain within the past 5 years. The grants address relevant themes for the respective domain and, as a rule, are engaging doctoral students.*

- *The visit confirmed that the indicator is addressed in a satisfactory manner, taking into consideration that Romanian Academy is not publicly funded for doctoral studies and does not charge fees. The documents fully demonstrate the existence of the requested activities and that resources are used optimally for the implementation of doctoral courses. However, more resources for implementing libraries, technical equipment and students' international mobility would be absolutely necessary, with obtaining governmental funding, but also with the participation to competitive European calls for attracting funds for infrastructure, human resources, namely the involved mentors/supervisors and mobility. According to suggestion of the Academic Staff at Romanian Academy, PhD students could participate in drawing up national economic strategies, prognosis related to lack of employment,*



collaborating to consulting firms. Also the intersectoral approach, with involving public and private sector can be useful for supporting the research activities.

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled. Some suggestion is provided.**

**Performance Indicator \*A.1.3.2.** *The percentage of doctoral students active at the time of the evaluation, who for at least six months receive additional funding sources besides government funding, through scholarships awarded by individual persons or by legal entities, or who are financially supported through research or institutional / human resources development grants is not less than 20%.*

- *The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, confirm the potential adequacy of the institution to requested indicator. However more detail should be offered for justifying the application of this criterion to the specificity of Romanian Academia's courses.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled. Some clarification is necessary.**

**Performance Indicator \*A.1.3.3.1** *At least 10% of the total amount of doctoral grants obtained by the university through institutional contracts and of tuition fees collected from the doctoral students enrolled in the paid tuition system is used to reimburse professional training expenses of doctoral students (attending conferences, summer schools, training, programs abroad, publication of specialty papers or other specific forms of dissemination etc.).*

- *The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, overall confirm the adequacy of the institution to requested indicator.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

## **Criterion A.2. Research infrastructure**

*\*general description of the criterion analysis.*

**Standard A.2.1.** *The IOSUD has a modern research infrastructure to support the conduct of doctoral studies' specific activities.*

*\*general description of the standard analysis.*

**Performance Indicator A.2.1.1.** *The venues and the material equipment available to the doctoral school enable the research activities in the evaluated domain to be carried out, in line with the assumed mission and objectives (computers, specific software, equipment, laboratory equipment, library, access to international databases etc.). The research infrastructure and the provision of research services are*

presented to the public through a specific platform. The research infrastructure described above, which was purchased and developed within the past 5 years will be presented distinctly.

- The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, confirm the adequacy of the institution to requested indicator. Overall, the Institution offers a sufficient support to doctoral courses and students' research, with a well organized library that offers the basic facilities for implementing researches in the domain.

- However, despite the sufficient level of the existing infrastructure, the international evaluator suggest to to reinforce the library's collection of books, particularly with incrementing the access to international scientific resources in the legal sector, namely printed international journals, and also to increment the number and variety of the online resources, concerning legal databases and journals, also in a interdisciplinary and internationally oriented perspective of the Courses. Can be useful and partially necessary to implement / improve the possibility of a remote access to databases, for offering a full possibility for the students to have studying materials at their home. Finally an improvement of the informatic equipment, hardware and software, to be use by the PhD students. could strengthen the infrastructure, with enhancing students' autonomy.

Recommendations:

**The indicator is sufficiently fulfilled. Some improvement is highly recommended.**

### **Criterion A.3. Quality of Human Resources**

*\*general description of the criterion analysis.*

Standard A.3.1. At the level of each domain there are sufficient qualified staff to ensure the conduct of doctoral study program.

*\*general description of the standard analysis.*

**Performance Indicator A.3.1.1.** Minimum three doctoral thesis advisors within that doctoral domain, and at least 50% of them (but no less than three) meet the minimum standards of the National Council for Attestation of University Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates (CNATDCU) in force at the time when the evaluation is carried out, which standards are required and mandatory for obtaining the enabling certification.

- The minimum standards of the National Council for Attestation of University Degrees, Diplomas and Certificates (CNATDCU) in force at the time when the evaluation is carried out are fully demonstrated by the Institution.

Recommendations:

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator \*A.3.1.2.** At least 50% of all doctoral advisors have a full-time employment contract for an indefinite period with the IOSUD.

- The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, confirm the satisfactory adequacy of the institution to requested indicator.



*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator A.3.1.3.** *The study subjects in the education program based on advanced higher education studies pertaining to the doctoral domain are taught by teaching staff or researchers who are doctoral thesis advisors / certified doctoral thesis advisors, professors / CS I or lecturer / CS II, with proved expertise in the field of the study subjects they teach, or other specialists in the field who meet the standards established by the institution in relation with the aforementioned teaching and research functions, as provided by the law.*

- *The study subjects in the education program are entirely based on advanced higher education studies pertaining to the doctoral domain of Law.*

- *The courses are taught by an excellent and fully adequate staff of experienced researchers, supported by qualified young scholars. They satisfactorily provide the necessary activities for successfully managing all doctoral activities from a scientific point of view.*

- *Overall, the scholars have the requested academic qualification for implementing the PhD courses' activities. Involved professors adequately encourage and support students to conduct quality scientific research, while providing them with opportunities to which they have access (for instance, with encouraging the participation to conferences, and favouring the possibility of publishing articles, etc.). Finally it is remarkable that professors involve students in research projects, also to supplement their limited financial subsidies.*

- *Overall, the Academia's courses are well aligned to European and international standards in the field.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled**

**Performance Indicator \*A.3.1.4.** *The percentage of doctoral thesis advisors who concomitantly coordinate more than 8 doctoral students, but no more than 12, who are themselves studying in doctoral programs<sup>2</sup> does not exceed 20%.*

- *The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, confirm the satisfactory adequacy of the institution to requested indicator.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Standard A.3.2.** *The Doctoral advisors within the domain are carrying out a scientific activity visible at international level.*

*\*general description of the standard analysis.*

**Performance Indicator A.3.2.1.** *At least 50% of the doctoral thesis advisors in the evaluated domain have at least 5 Web of Science- or ERIH-indexed publications in magazines of impact, or other achievements of relevant significance for that domain, including international-level contributions that indicate progress in scientific research - development - innovation for the evaluated domain. The aforementioned doctoral thesis advisors enjoy international awareness within the past five years, consisting of: membership on scientific boards of international publications and conferences; membership on boards of international professional associations; guests in conferences or expert groups working abroad, or membership on doctoral defense commissions at universities abroad or co-leading with universities abroad. For Arts and Sports and Physical Education Sciences, doctoral thesis advisors shall prove their international visibility within the past five years by their membership on the boards of professional associations, membership in organizing committees of arts events and international competitions, membership on juries or umpire teams in artistic events or international competitions.*

- *The documents, the information provided by the involved people at visited Institution and the direct knowledge by the undersigned international evaluator of the scientific activities of some involved scholars confirm their international visibility and the high consideration of their studies and publications in the legal domain.*

- *The requested percentage for performing indicator is respected, taking into consideration the international parameters in the matter of citations for social sciences.*

*Recommendations:*

***The indicator is fulfilled.***

**Performance Indicator \*A.3.2.2.** *At least 50% of the doctoral thesis advisors in a specific doctoral study domain continue to be active in their scientific field, and acquire at least 25% of the score requested by the minimal CNATDCU standards in force at the time of the evaluation, which are required and mandatory for acquiring their enabling certificate, based on their scientific results within the past five years.*

- *The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, confirm the satisfactory adequacy of the institution to requested indicator.*

*Recommendations:*

***The indicator is fulfilled.***

## **Domain B. EDUCATIONAL EFFECTIVENESS**

*The domain analysis was conducted according to Romanian legislation in the matter and the international and European best practices in evaluating doctoral schools.*

### **Criterion B.1. The number, quality and diversity of candidates enrolled for the admission contest**



Standard B.1.1. *The institution organizing doctoral studies has the capacity to attract candidates from outside the higher education institution or a number of candidates exceeding the number of seats available.*

*\*general description of the standard analysis.*

**Performance Indicator \*B.1.1.1.** *The ratio between the number of graduates of masters' programs of other higher education institutions, national or foreign, who have enrolled for the doctoral admission contest within the past five years and the number of seats funded by the state budget, put out through contest within the doctoral domain is at least 0.2 or the ratio between the number of candidates within the past five years and the number of seats funded by the state budget put out through contest within the doctoral studies domain is at least 1,2.*

*- Taking into consideration the specificity of the Academia's courses, the capacity to attract a number of candidates exceeding the number of seats available is ensured by the high prestige of the Institution, the high quality and relevance of the involved scholars, and the well organized PhD School is at the basis of this element that fully addresses the indicator's content.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

Standard B.1.2 *Candidates admitted to doctoral studies demonstrate academic, research and professional performance.*

**Performance Indicator \*B.1.2.1.** *Admission to doctoral study programs is based on selection criteria including: previous academic, research and professional performance, their interest for scientific or arts/sports research, publications in the domain and a proposal for a research subject. Interviewing the candidate is compulsory, as part of the admission procedure.*

*- The fully respect of the indicator is demonstrated by the documentation and confirmed by other information provided by the Institutions' involved people. Selection criteria are coherent to the indicator.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator B.1.2.2.** *The expelling rate, including renouncement / dropping out of doctoral students 3, respectively 4, years after admission<sup>3</sup> does not exceed 30%.*

*- The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, confirm the adequacy of the institution to requested indicator.*

*Recommendations:*

## **Criterion B.2. The content of doctoral programs**

*\*general description of the criterion analysis.*

*Standard B.2.1. The training program based on advanced university studies is appropriate to improve doctoral students' research skills and to strengthen ethical behavior in science.*

**Performance Indicator B.2.1.1.** *The training program based on advanced academic studies includes at least 3 disciplines relevant to the scientific research training of doctoral students; at least one of these disciplines is intended to study in-depth the research methodology and/or the statistical data processing.*

*- The training program is seriously based to the better methodological approaches in the scientific fields. The in-depth involved disciplines are managed with a concrete attention to the scientific methodology. The Director and professors are renowned scholars with great experience in the field and high level of commitment in managing the school.*

*- The international evaluator recommends a careful consideration of Academic Staff's suggestion to increase the duration of the courses from 3 to at least 4 years, also taking into consideration that most of the PhD students choose to extend their doctoral stage with at least one year in order to finalize their thesis. The increment of years would be also useful also for improving the interaction of the students with other PhD students, to exchange good practices, and to share the results of their research. The professors' suggestion sounds as excellent for offering more time to the students to elaborate their dissertations, for implementing international mobility, for improving interdisciplinary sensitivity, for stimulating best practicing in research and for sharing research experience at domestic and international level, with overall stimulating a constructive scientific dialogue.*

*- The field of law is part of a larger department alongside economics and sociology. If this can be useful from an organizational point of view, and can also stimulate integrated and interdisciplinary activities, the international evaluator believes that the legal sector should have a specific autonomy, taking into account the essential role of legal studies, their potential in connecting Academia with public institutions and with the private sector, and their role in the progressive alignment of the country with European standards.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled. Some recommendation is provided.**

**Performance Indicator B.2.1.2.** *At least one discipline is dedicated to Ethics and Intellectual Property in scientific research or there are well-defined topics on these subjects within a discipline taught in the doctoral program.*

*- The intersection between different legal perspectives is at the basis of more approaches by the involved disciplines. Particularly, the role of comparative legal approach, clarified during the meetings, is well based on a ethical perception of law. Overall, the links between ethics and IPR are considered into the PhD Courses.*

*- The role of disciplines, recognized as essential in the legal background, at European and worldwide level, such as roman law and legal history is is not entirely clarified.*



*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled. Some recommendation is provided.**

**Performance Indicator B.2.1.3.** *The IOSUD has mechanisms to ensure that the academic training program based on advanced university studies addresses „the learning outcomes”, specifying the knowledge, skills, responsibility and autonomy that doctoral students should acquire after completing each discipline or through the research activities<sup>4</sup>.*

- *According to the IOSUD indications, the academic training program of the Institution well addresses “the learning outcomes”, specifying the knowledge, skills, responsibility and autonomy that doctoral students should acquire after completing each discipline or through the research activities . It is remarkable that students have to prepare at least 2 scientific articles, one as first author before finishing the thesis, because that strongly increase their autonomy and research experience.*

- *The objective is ensured by a simple but credible system of evaluation of Phd students progresses.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator B.2.1.4.** *All along the duration of the doctoral training, doctoral students in the domain receive counselling/guidance from functional guidance commissions, which is reflected in written guidance and feedback or regular meeting.*

- *Overall, the relationship between students and their supervisor is excellent. The interation with mentors / supervisors is satisfactory and well organized, both in presence and remotely.*

- *The PhD students are well oriented in their research activities by the involved mentors and, overall, by the coordinator and the PhD board that follows periodically and with accuracy the progresses of the studentes, also identifyng possible difficulties and proposing correcting activities.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator B.2.1.5.** *For a doctoral study domain, the ratio between the number of doctoral students and the number of teaching staff/researchers providing doctoral guidance must not exceed 3:1.*

- *The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, confirm the adequacy of the PhD Courses to requested indicator.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

### **Criterion B.3. The results of doctoral studies and procedures for their evaluation.**

*Standard B.3.1. Doctoral students capitalize on the research through presentations at scientific conferences, scientific publications, technological transfer, patents, products and service orders.*

*\*general description of the standard analysis.*

**Performance Indicator B.3.1.1.** *For the evaluated domain, the evaluation commission will be provided with at least one paper or some other relevant contribution per doctoral student who has obtained a doctor's title within the past 5 years. From this list, the members of the evaluation commission shall randomly select 5 such papers / relevant contributions per doctoral study domain for review. At least 3 selected papers must contain significant original contributions in the respective domain.*

*- The provided papers contain significant original contributions in the Law domain that fully confirm the adequacy of scientific value of doctoral activities and the very good implementation of PhD courses.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator \*B.3.1.2.** *The ratio between the number of presentations of doctoral students who completed their doctoral studies within the evaluated period (past 5 years), including posters, exhibitions made at prestigious international events (organized in the country or abroad) and the number of doctoral students who have completed their doctoral studies within the evaluated period (past 5 years) is at least 1.*

*- The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, fully confirm the adequacy of the PhD Courses to requested indicator.*

*Recommendations:*

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

*Standard B.3.2. The Doctoral School engages a significant number of external scientific specialists in the commissions for public defense of doctoral theses in the analyzed domain.*

*\*general description of the standard analysis.*

**Performance Indicator \*B.3.2.1.** *The number of doctoral theses allocated to one specialist coming from a higher education institution, other than the evaluated IOSUD should not exceed two (2) in a year for the theses coordinated by the same doctoral thesis advisor.*

*- The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, confirm the adequacy of the PhD Courses to requested indicator.*



Recommendations:

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator \*B.3.2.2.** *The ratio between the doctoral theses allocated to one scientific specialist coming from a higher education institution, other than the institution where the defense on the doctoral thesis is organized, and the number of doctoral theses presented in the same doctoral study domain in the doctoral school should not exceed 0.3, considering the past five years. Only those doctoral study domains in which minimum ten doctoral theses have been presented within the past five years should be analyzed.*

- *The documents and the visit, through the online discussion, confirm the adequacy of the PhD Courses to requested indicator.*

Recommendations:

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

## **Domain C. QUALITY MANAGEMENT**

### **Criterion C.1. Existence and periodic implementation of the internal quality assurance system**

*Standard C.1.1. There are an institutional framework and procedures in place and relevant internal quality assurance policies, applied for monitoring the internal quality assurance.*

*\*general description of the standard analysis.*

**Performance Indicator C.1.1.1.** *The Doctoral school in the respective university study domain shall demonstrate the continuous development of the evaluation process and its internal quality assurance following a procedure developed and applied at the level of the IOSUD, the following assessed criteria being mandatory:*

- (a) the scientific work of Doctoral advisors;*
- (b) the infrastructure and logistics necessary to carry out the research activity;*
- (c) the procedures and subsequent rules based on which doctoral studies are organized;*
- d) the scientific activity of doctoral students;*
- e) the training program based on advanced academic studies of doctoral students;*
- f) social and academic services (including for participation at different events, publishing papers etc.) and counselling made available to doctoral students.*

- *The evaluation process and the internal quality assurance is fully respectful of the procedure developed and applied at the level of the IOSUD, and all the mandatory criteria are adequately addressed. Particularly it is remarkable that Every institute in overall the Academy's structure is directed by a Research Council, including representatives from all research institutions and also from the Employees Union. This council has periodical meetings (twice a year), in order to analyze the research results in the institute.*



- The performance indicator is satisfied.

Recommendations:

**The indicator is fulfilled.**

**Performance Indicator \*C.1.1.2.** Mechanisms are implemented during the stage of the doctoral study program to enable feedback from doctoral students allowing to identify their needs, as well as their overall level of satisfaction with the doctoral study program in order to ensure continuous improvement of the academic and administrative processes. Following the analysis of the results, there is evidence that an action plan was drafted and implemented.

- Overall, the Institution ensures the implementation of good mechanisms of quality assurance during the stage of the doctoral study program.

- The PhD's organisation offer good opportunities for stimulating informal but useful feedback from doctoral students to identify their needs.

- However, the evaluation is not performed by satisfaction questionnaires with an annual frequency. In the light of international standards and best practices it is recommended a regular recognition about students' satisfaction through the anonymized compilation of questionnaires, to collect and manage according to national and European rules about data management.

- Despite the Academia experiences informal exchanges of comments between students and academic staff, the international evaluator also suggests the formal implementation of periodical mandatory meetings with PhD students. Through these planned meetings the PhD students' level of satisfaction would be adequately monitored. These meetings could offer a good opportunity for ensuring the improvement of the academic and administrative processes, also in the light of students' proposals and criticism.

Recommendations:

**The indicator is fulfilled. Some suggestion is provided.**
