INTRODUCTION:

I. The External Evaluation procedure

The organization provided to the Committee all the necessary documents. The committee visited the site on the 11th of February and evaluated its premises.

II. The Internal Evaluation procedure

The committee feels that all documents provided were of high quality. The college staff were very helpful and transparent.

FINDINGS:

1. EFFECTIVENESS OF TEACHING WORK – AVAILABLE RESOURCES

- Organization of Teaching Work

Overall the organization of teaching and available resources are satisfactory, however, the committee has the following issues to raise:

- The statutory mechanisms for the support of students and the communication with the teaching personnel are not clearly articulated for distance learning students.
- The committee would like to see a Student Handbook where appropriate mechanisms for student performance are clearly explained and articulated.
- Support mechanisms for students with problematic academic performance are not established yet.
- The organization should either appoint a member of academic staff as a mentor or provide support and training to an academic member of staff to become a pedagogic support for the programme.
- There are no documents that provide information concerning the organization's mechanisms for complaint management and for dispute resolution.

- Teaching

- The committee feels that the teaching component of the program is well designed, however we have to suggest that teaching materials (assigned readings) should be updated.
- The translation of key texts to Greek language should be considered.
- The committee suggests the college endeavors to create collaborative online activities among students.
- The committee suggests that the college should organize a weekend for students to meet each other and staff. Issues of orientation and guidance should be discussed.

- Teaching personnel

- The committee commends the recruitment of tutors with specialist expertise in the field of security management
- The committee commends the long experience with teaching with other programs with similar content.
- The program leader demonstrated a good understanding of the program and the challenges in becoming an online program.
- We suggest the recruitment of a Full time faculty member holding a PhD degree.

2. PROGRAM OF STUDY AND HIGHER EDUCATION QUALIFICATIONS

- Purpose and Objectives and learning outcomes of the Program of Study
- The committee commends the college for establishing strong links with the private security sector. We also commend the inclusion of a theoretical and research component in the program.
- There is a space to develop more detailed assessment methods and to diversify teaching material.
- We suggest the faculty should rephrase the programs objectives and learning outcomes so that they can be measured.
- Structure and Content of the Program of studies
- In the future the Program Coordinator should provide an assessment matrix (scheduling of assignments and types of assignments) and a learning outcome assessment table.
- Quality Assurance of the Program of studies
- The institution seems to have quality assurance mechanisms for the conventional programs of study, but has not developed yet the appropriate tools and procedures for a Distance Learning Program.
- Management of the Program of Study
- International Dimension of the Program of Study
- No similar programs in Cyprus. Compatible with other International programs of study.
- Connection with the labor market and the society
- The committee commends the organization's established relations with all the major security companies in Cyprus, and also its strong links with government departments and agencies.

3. RESEARCH WORK AND SYNERGIES WITH TEACHING

- Research Teaching Synergies
- The committee suggests the College drafts a written research funding policy.
- We recommend that the institution supports faculty members to be more involved in research activities, publish research papers in international journals and present papers in International Conferences.

4. ADMINISTRATION SERVICES, STUDENT WELFARE AND SUPPORT OF TEACHING WORK

- Administrative Mechanisms

- The committee suggests that the institution develops specific criteria in order to evaluate the administrative mechanisms for Distance Learning program needs.
- Committee suggests that the College also reviews its policies for delivering terrorism related content online.

- Infrastructures / Support

- The committee commends the college for employing a member of administrative staff to provide training for academic staff regarding the distance learning platform
- Financial Resources

5. DISTANCE LEARNING PROGRAMS

- The committee notes the absence of a Distance Learning Specialist and also the absence of a pedagogical unit in order to support teachers, administrators and students.
- The committee suggests that the institution revise its organization's structure to support distance learning programs.
- The committee suggests the provision of appropriate student training on distance learning infrastructure.

6. DOCTORAL PROGRAMS OF STUDY

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS OF THE EXTERNAL EVALUATION COMMITTEE¹

The committee finds that the program is unique in the Greek speaking societies. It is cohesive and applied. It is closely related to the contemporary needs of the society. There is a strong commitment from the management, academic staff, and administration. Finally the teaching staff are well qualified and posses the specialist skills necessary to deliver this program.

The committee is pleased to see the amount of investment put it already into distance learning infrastructure and feels positive that is going to be continued.

The committee would like to make some suggestions for the improvement of the program:

- Establishment of a Pedagogical unit that will have the full responsibility for the implementation and monitoring of the distance learning programs.
- Establish administrative support mechanisms for students and teachers for distance learning programs.
- Seek to appoint academics with a relevant Phd degree.
- Encourage academic staff to be more involved to research activities with the field of Security Management. Publish in recognized international journals and participate in International conferences.

- Establishment of a Pedagogical unit that will have the full responsibility for the implementation and monitoring of the distance learning programs.
- Establish administrative support mechanisms for students and teachers for distance learning programs.
- Seek to appoint academics with a relevant Phd degree.
- Encourage academic staff to be more involved in research activities within the field of Security Management, publish in recognized international journals and participate in International conferences.
